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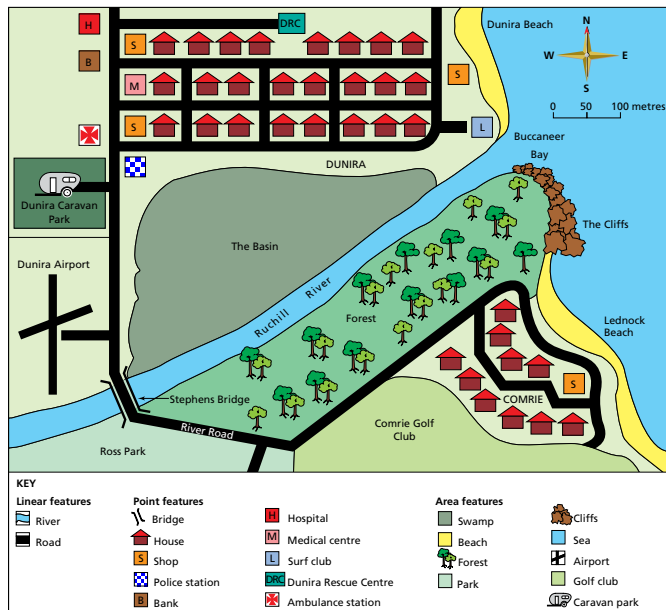
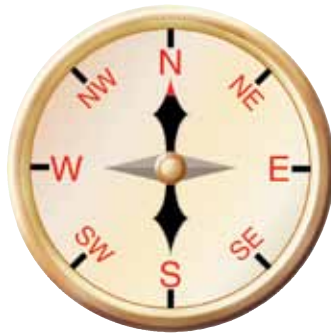
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Using the QR codes in this atlas

The black and white graphic inside the turtle is a type of barcode known as a **QR** (Quick Response) code. These QR codes are found on many pages of the atlas and can be scanned by a tablet or smartphone. The device needs a camera and an app designed for reading QR codes. Once you have such an app installed on your device, simply open the app, hover your camera over a QR code and scan it. This will take you to online videos and web pages.
